industry workers and we would like to develop a system for helping industry to quickly and effectively access scientific expertise when dealing with the media. These two issues were listed as top priorities by industry proponents at our Halifax meeting.

We are now well under way in making preparations for Aquaculture Canada^{OM} 2007, which will be held September 23rd to the 26th, 2007 in Edmonton, Alberta at the Shaw Conference Centre (http://www.shawconferencecentre.com/welcome.asp)



with guest hotel rooms at the nearby Westin Edmonton. This will be the AAC's 24th annual conference and the first time we have held the event in a Prairie province. And, yes, there is a strong and healthy aquaculture industry in Alberta! In 2005, the province had approximately \$10 million in revenue from 730 tonnes of cultured fish: \$4 million of this came from trout stocking and U-fish operations and \$6 million came from various table fish species (trout, tilapia, eel, buffalo fish, and triploid grass carp). Alberta has about 100 commercial producers with most of the full-time operators having sophisticated indoor recirculation facilities. Our conference theme is "Securing Sustainable Economic Prosperity" which ties in with the current economic boom that Alberta is experiencing. I have visited the Shaw Conference Centre and it is a fantastic facility for hosting our event. I look forward to seeing you all there in September!

I am very happy to announce that we are holding a competition for the AC07 conference logo. Traditionally, the Association has hired a professional artist to produce the logo, but last year we solicited designs from the AAC membership. This was a huge success and I would like to continue this trend started by Chris Hendry. Full details on the logo contest are given in this issue of Watermark. There will be a cash prize of \$200 for the winning entry!

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome two new members to the AAC Board of Directors: Terralynn Lander (Fisheries and Oceans Canada) and Julie Roy (Regroupement des mariculteurs du Québec). 

Aquaculture Statistics


Operating revenues generated by Canada's aquaculture industry rebounded to an all-time high in 2005 in the wake of increased production and exports. The industry reported record revenues of \$752.6 million, up 11.0% from 2004. This increase ended two consecutive years of declines.

Tilapia Biology, Culture, and Nutrition

Food Products Press® (an import of Haworth Press, Inc.)

This extensive 19 chapter book is a product of over 2 dozen authors and edited by Chhorn Lin (USDA) and Carl Webster (Kentucky State University). The diversity of contributing authors results in an extremely thorough coverage of Tilapia culture. Chapters range from the basics of nutrition and husbandry to more 'specialized' aspects, such as saline water production and streptococcal vaccinology. The text is well populated with appropriate figures, photographs and tables to support the narrative. It is written and organised to cater to all audiences; and will appeal to novices and seasoned experts alike.

This book is a good candidate to become the 'Tilapia Bible'. Anyone perusing information on tilapia culture will no doubt be leafing through its pages at some point.
